

FIVE GAMES SUSPENDED BY RAIN MONDAY NIGHT



Five Roy Hobbs World Series Veterans Division games were suspended by rain Monday evening.

All 5 games will be completed Wednesday at 10 a.m. at the Lee County Sports Complex. Here is the schedule:

Minneapolis Millers at Pensacola Barracudas, LC1

Cincinnati Colts at St. Paul Senators, LC2

Glass City Black Sox at Staten Island Bombers, LC3

North Yuma Yankees at Fort Myers Hooters, LC5

Jupiter Hammerheads at Tallahassee Hawks, LCS

The Yankees and Hooters will be in line for a stadium game on Thursday's schedule.

It is the policy of the Roy Hobbs World Series to try to play every

game to completion, even in rain situations. If 2 innings of a game are completed, the game is suspended, to be resumed at that point. If less than 2 innings are completed, the game is restarted.

The Monday night game at Lee County Stadium was delayed by rain in the middle of the 6th inning, but the delay was only 20 minutes, and the game was played to completion, with the Puerto Rico Cardinals winning 8-1.

The weather forecast for the next 3 days indicates a good chance of additional rain like we experienced Monday night.

Roy Hobbs Baseball will do it's best to make sure all games are played as we work with the grounds crews and dodge raindrops.

Eighteen Years of P. R. Astros and Roy Hobbs

The Puerto Rico Astros ball club travels with confidence these days. With a manager that is an orthopedic surgeon, they know that any injuries will be handled with the best of care.

If somebody on the Puerto Rico Astros happens to have the hard luck of a broken bone, Pedro is right there to help.

Pedro Reyes primarily works on trauma patients. He has even taken care of himself a couple of times.

Playing catcher in 1992 he suffered a hand injury. And again, just last year, a ball hit his hand and his thumb wound up completely dislocated. Obviously, that demanded immediate attention, so he twisted it back into place with a sharp jerk. He worked so quickly, he says there was no pain.

He has also treated other ballplayers a couple of times when they were unfortunate enough to break a bone while pitching.

He has no advice to give to avoid such an injury except: "Don't overthrow, just go with the flow."

Being in medical school, Pedro did not have much

time to play baseball in college. Once he did start playing, he stuck with it. This is his 18th year at the Roy Hobbs World Series and he is looking forward to coming back for years to come.

Since there are three teams from Puerto Rico in the Veterans Division this year, Pedro had a player shortage problem. However, with some help from five players who had moved to Florida from Puerto Rico, he was able to bring a very competitive team.

In the Roy Hobbs World Series so far, they have two wins and one loss.

The Roy Hobbs Foundation was established to raise monies for research on finding a cure for Leukemia and to assist our Challenged Athlete friends.

Pitching

For the record, here is a repeat of what was said Saturday evening about pitching eligibility for the playoffs.

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings during pool play.

This is a reminder to all managers that all pitching statistics need to be updated through the first 4 games by noon Wednesday.

When playoffs begin Thursday or Friday, all managers will be supplied with a list of pitchers eligible to start-close.

Finally, in the playoffs, those “non-qualified” middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is important as the “spirit of the rule” is that these non-qualified pitchers who are used as “inning-eaters” are

players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

Just a reminder to Managers to enter their statistics after each game on line.

The program will give you cumulative totals for all your games, and Roy Hobbs will be checking those on Wednesday morning to produce pitching data to determine which pitchers will be eligible for starting-closing roles in the playoffs.

MVP & team awards

MVP and team award certificates should be redeemed at the Roy Hobbs World Series Headquarters at the Lee County Stadium ticket office when the time comes.

Every team has an MVP certificate to redeem, and Managers or the honored player can come to the office and see Tony Anarumo or Rob Giffen to get the award order taken care of.

The team award, which goes to any team winning at least 5 games in the World Series, can be redeemed at the office as well. Please see Tony Anarumo or Rob Giffen to redeem your award.
