Friday's AA-A-B playoff matchups announced at MacDaddy's tonight

The Veterans AA, A & B Playoff pairings will be announced at a Pairings Party at MacDaddy's tonight (Thursday).

The pairings should be announced at approximately 8 p.m. at the Party, which will be the **FIRST** place the pairings will be available. The Pairings Party begins at 7 p.m., runs until 9:30 p.m. Finger foods will be available along with a cash bar.

All players, not just managers, are invited! The B Division will be set up by draw at the Party. After the pairings, we will have some raffle items to give away.

(MacDaddy's is located on Daniels Parkway, halfway between Six Mile Cypress Parkway and I-75. It is on the North side of Daniels Parkway, in front of the Best Western Hotel.)

Pairings for all of Friday's playoff games will also be posted at the World Series Headquarters at Lee County Complex and on the Roy Hobbs website before 8:30 p.m. today (Thursday).

Please note that the schedules will NOT be posted until after the announcement at the Pairings party.

Playoff assignments in AA-A-B

After Thursday's pool games, the remaining teams will be separated into 3 divisions for single-elimination playoffs.

That separation will be based on records, runs allowed, and other tiebreakers.

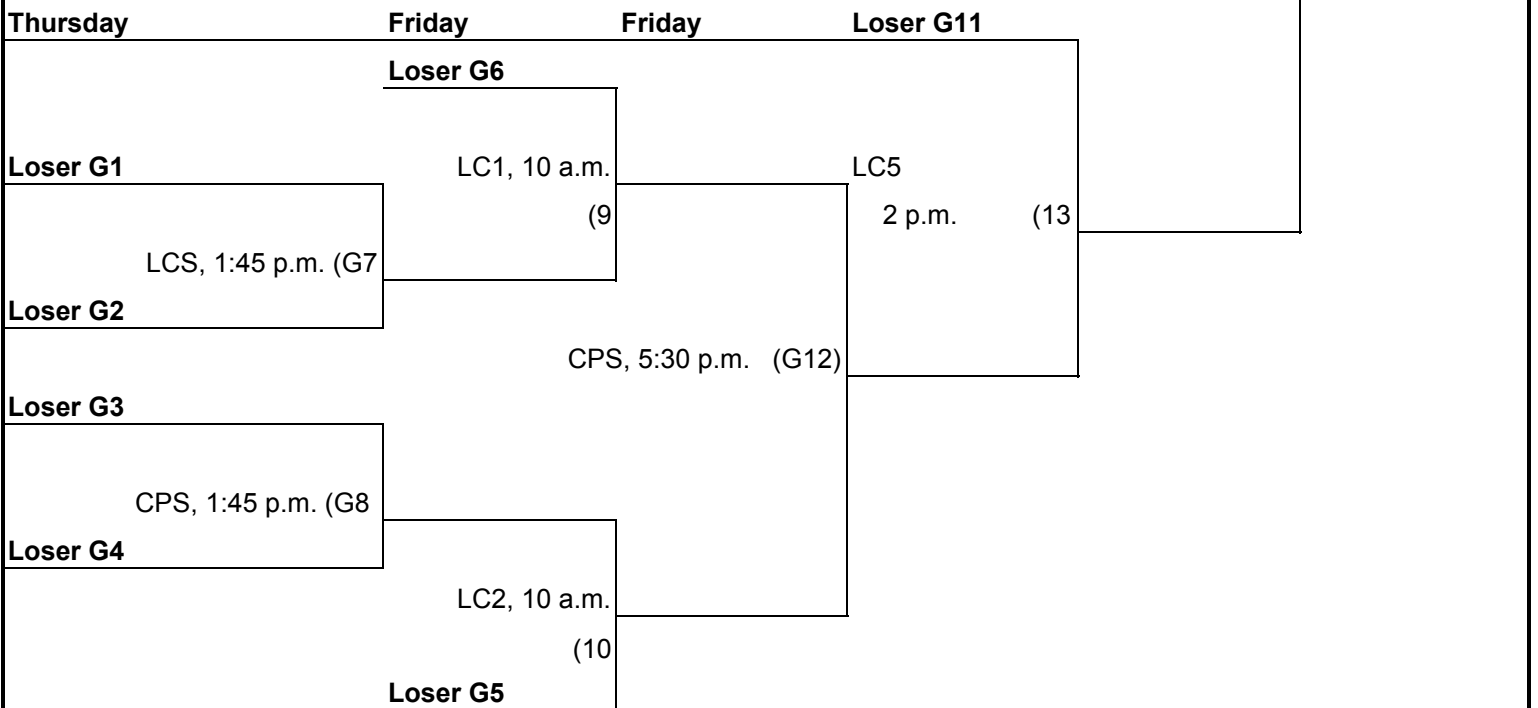
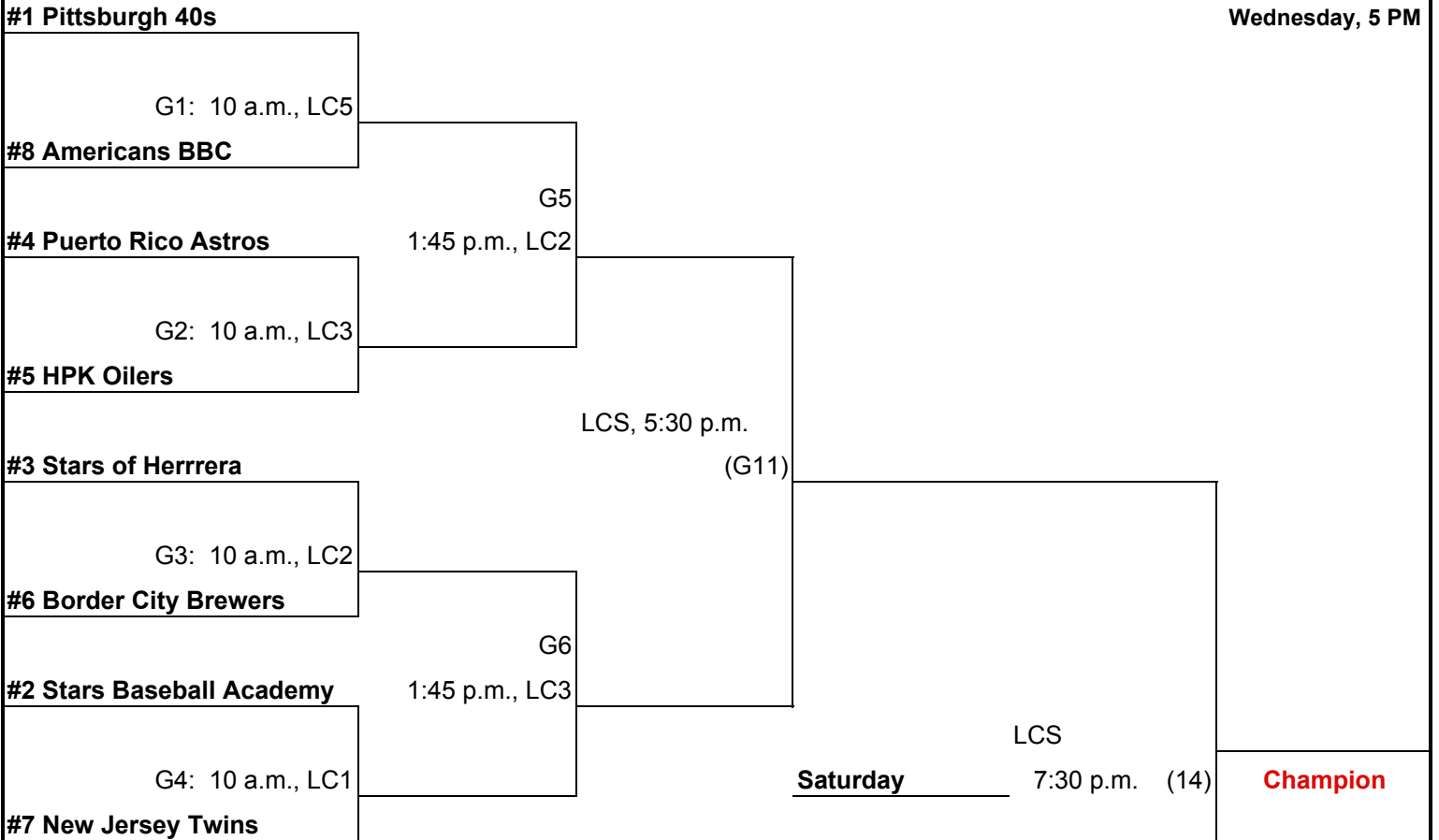
We anticipate having all 36 teams in those three playoff brackets. If there is more than one 0-5 team, the winless teams will be matched against each other on Friday. As of Wednesday afternoon, there were 3 0-4 teams; Thursday's action will determine the Friday configuration. (With only 1 0-5 team, all teams are included in the playoffs.)

In the AA, A and B divisions, first round and quarterfinal games will be scheduled Friday, with semifinals and championships set for Saturday.

The seeding in the B Division will be done by draw at MacDaddy's Thursday night.

AAAA-AAA seedings by the numbers with a question here-there

The AAAA and AAA divisions were assigned Wednesday for double-elimination play starting Thursday.

The seedings were relatively easy to determine by the numbers; however, there were aberrations in both divisions.

In AAAA, seeds 1-thru-7 were easy. The Chicago Giants were 8th, and the Americans Baseball Club had petitioned Roy Hobbs for a berth in the AAAA playoffs, despite their 0-4 record.

The Giants agreed to drop to AAA, allowing the Americans to take the #8 spot in AAAA.

In AAA, after the committee quickly selected three teams – New Jersey Mets (4-0), Minneapolis Millers (4-0), and the Tribute Orioles (3-1).

The committee settled on 3 teams as candidates for the 4th slot – North Yuma Yankees (4-0), Puerto Rico Cardinales and Margate Hurricanes, both 3-1 – although several teams presented strong credentials.

Strength of schedule came into play in the discussion:

Yankees: 4-0, beat all 4 teams on their schedule, allowing only 11 runs. However, weak strength of schedule as opponents were a combined 4-12.

Cardinales: 3-1, good strength of schedule, opponents were combined 9-7; one loss was to 4-0 Mets; runs allowed 10. And Cardinales have won the AA championship each of the last two years.

Hurricanes: 3-1, 9-7 strength of schedule; but one loss was to Ohio Indians, a 1-3 team. And Margate beat 2 3-1 teams (NW Indiana Dogs and Omaha Indians), while allowing 13 runs.

In the final analysis, the committee eliminated the Yankees on their strength of schedule and chose the Cardinales over Margate because it felt a team that had won AA in consecutive years had earned an opportunity to go to the next level.

In AAAA first-round matchups, the traditional 1-8 and 4-5 first-round games were adjusted with the first-seed Giants playing the #5 Staten Island Reds and #4 Glass City Bandits playing #8 PSOF Knights because Knights and Giants come from same league, and, by scheduling guidelines, cannot meet in the first round of the playoffs.

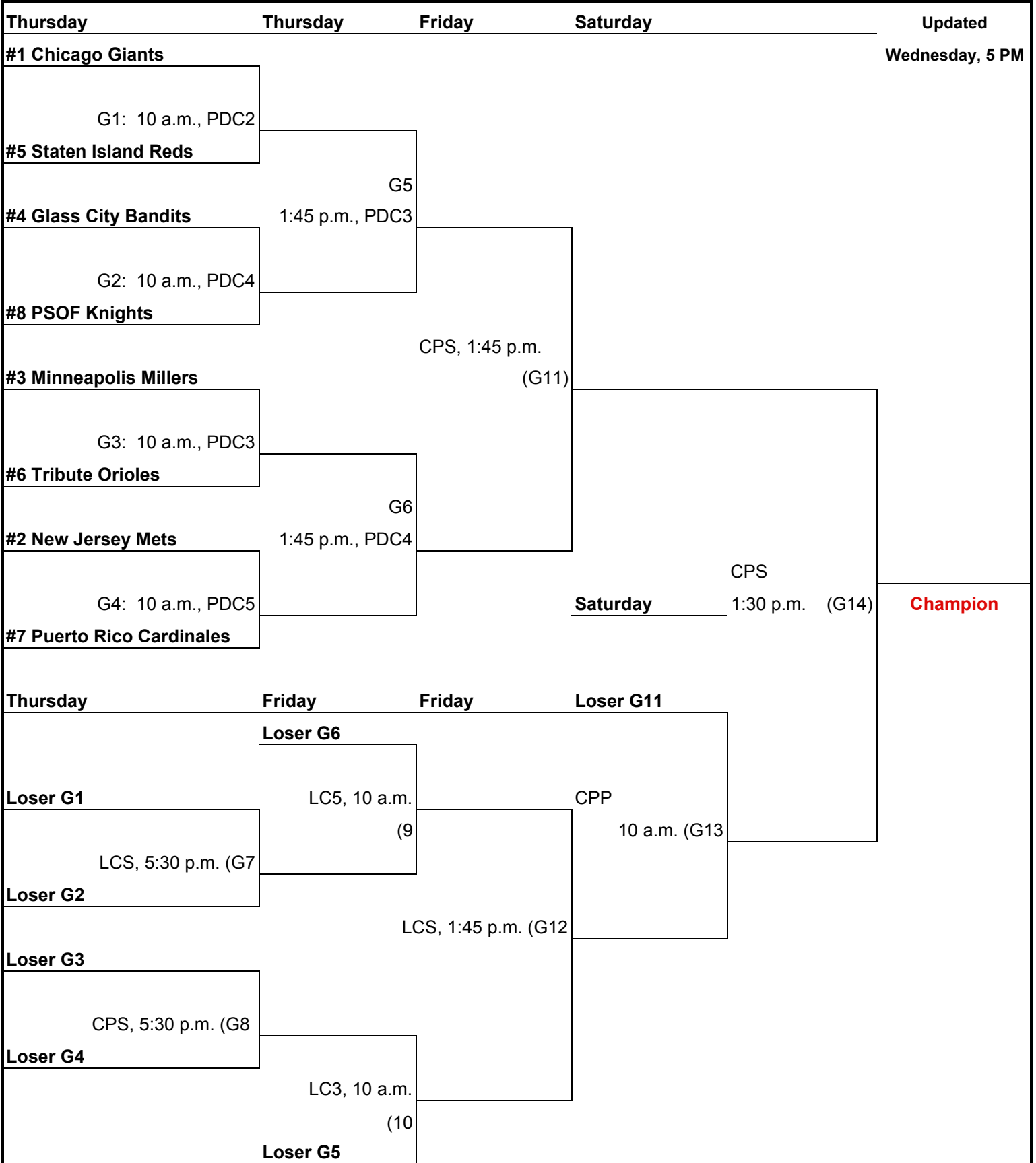
