

RH committee meets Wednesday to determine 45 AAAA Playoffs

The Roy Hobbs Masters Division Advisory Committee will meet at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at Roy Hobbs World Series headquarters to determine the set up and seeding for the Masters AAAA playoffs, which will be announced no later than 8 p.m. Wednesday.

Although all AAAA managers have been invited to participate on the committee, any interested managers are welcome to come and be involved too. Anyone interested in attending should contact Tom Giffen at World Series Headquarters.

Masters play began Sunday with 12 teams in the AAAA hunt. The Committee will determine the 8 teams that remain in the AAAA double-elimination playoffs and then seed those teams. The Masters AAAA double-elimination playoffs start Thursday.

The remaining 4 teams will be added to the general pool and play a fifth pool game Thursday. Those teams then will be seeded in the AAA or AA single-elimination brackets for Friday.

Thursday's schedule for both the AAAA playoffs and the Masters Pool game 5 for the 52 overall pool teams will be announced at approximately 5 p.m. Wednesday.

The seeding and scheduling for all Thursday games will be posted at World Series Headquarters at Lee County Stadium and be available on royhobbs.com as well as being put on the Roy Hobbs schedule line: **239.533.7694**.

Japanese player joins other former pros on Kashi All Stars

A mix of players from many countries have played in the Roy Hobbs World Series over the years---German, Russian, Dutch...

But this 25th year marks a first...there's a player from Japan and even though he has United States ties, he still lives in Japan.

Tetsu Yofu, 40, is one of four former Big League players on the Kashi All Stars team in the Veterans Division.

Tetsu is from Fujiwara City, Japan where he operates the Roots Baseball Academy. He has seven instructors working for him and the classes consist of students ages 8 to 28.

He has played baseball since he could swing a bat. In Japan he has been around, playing for the "Brother Elephant" team in Venezuela, as well as teams in Mexico and Taiwan. He won an MVP award during his period in Taiwan.

Tetsu attracted the attention of the Chicago White Sox and pitched in their Triple A farm club for two years.

His pitches: "Fast ball, very fast ball, power ball."

How did he learn of the Hobbs Series?

Word of mouth, but as Assistant Manager Bob Offret says of his players "network."

Tetsu likes the way the tournament currently runs and all the players he has met.

He hints that next year there could be an all Japanese team coming to the 26th Roy Hobbs Series

Other former professional players include Carlos Castillo - White Sox, Rockies and Red Sox; Alex Ochoa - Red Sox; and John Juden of the Brewers, Indians and Yankees. And yes, he has his World Series ring.

This is the first year in the Series for the Kashi All Stars. The team gets its name from their sponsor, the Kashi Sports Company in Japan.

Assistant Manager Bob, a retired Akron, OH policeman said the team arrived "cold" and didn't practice once. Most of the members live in the Miami area.

When asked if they will be back next year, Bob says, "Yes."

No card, no play, and Roy Hobbs reserves the right to do card checks at games. Players without their ID cards will not be allowed to continue to play and will be required to bring his ID card to the Tournament Director or Site Manager before being allowed to return to the playing field.

Replacement cards are available at the Roy Hobbs Headquarters. Bring a photo ID to verify identity, and the fee is \$5.

So, please don't lose the card and please keep it with you.

Pitching

For the record, here is a recap on the rules on pitching eligibility for the playoffs.

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings - 6 outs or 10 hitters - during pool play.

This is a reminder to all managers that all pitching statistics need to be updated through the first 4 games by noon Wednesday.

When AAAA playoffs begin Thursday, all managers will be supplied with a list of pitchers eligible to start-close.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are

So here's a reminder to Managers to enter their statistics after each game on line.

The program will give you cumulative totals for all your games, and Roy Hobbs will be checking those on Wednesday morning to produce pitching data to determine which pitchers will be eligible for starting-closing roles in the playoffs.
